### Restore II Report

This is to bring you up to date with Restore II progress. In late January work started in the Sanctuary with taking up all the pews, removing the carpet, and removing all the chancel and choir structures not needed for the renovation. The new sanctuary sprinkler system installation will begin soon.

Moving outside we are sure you have observed much dirt movement. There are several explanations. First, all of the silk fencing plus a water retention pond are dictated by City, County, and Environmental Code to prevent soil contaminants getting into our streams. While necessary the dictates, and some dealings with unreasonable inspectors, made for construction time lost. Second, new drain and septic lines for the new bathrooms are now in place. Third, top soil was removed and replaced with proper compacting dirt brought in for all new areas. Lastly, and ongoing, is much digging to prepare for pouring the concrete footings. As you drove past, it may have resembled little boys playing in the dirt. Some days Ray Manus and I felt the same; however, this is the slow part with construction. More visible signs will soon appear with concrete flooring and wall construction. Very soon work will start on the new parking lot/drop off canopy area. Every effort will be made to complete this part before Kindergarten restart in late August. In closing, we have been very pleased with the Lichty General Contractor Team and with each sub-contractor. With the best of planning there are decisions to be made almost daily. Most days one or both Rays (Manus and Dunahoo) are on site; the two meet biweekly with the architect, general contractor, project manager, and project superintendent. 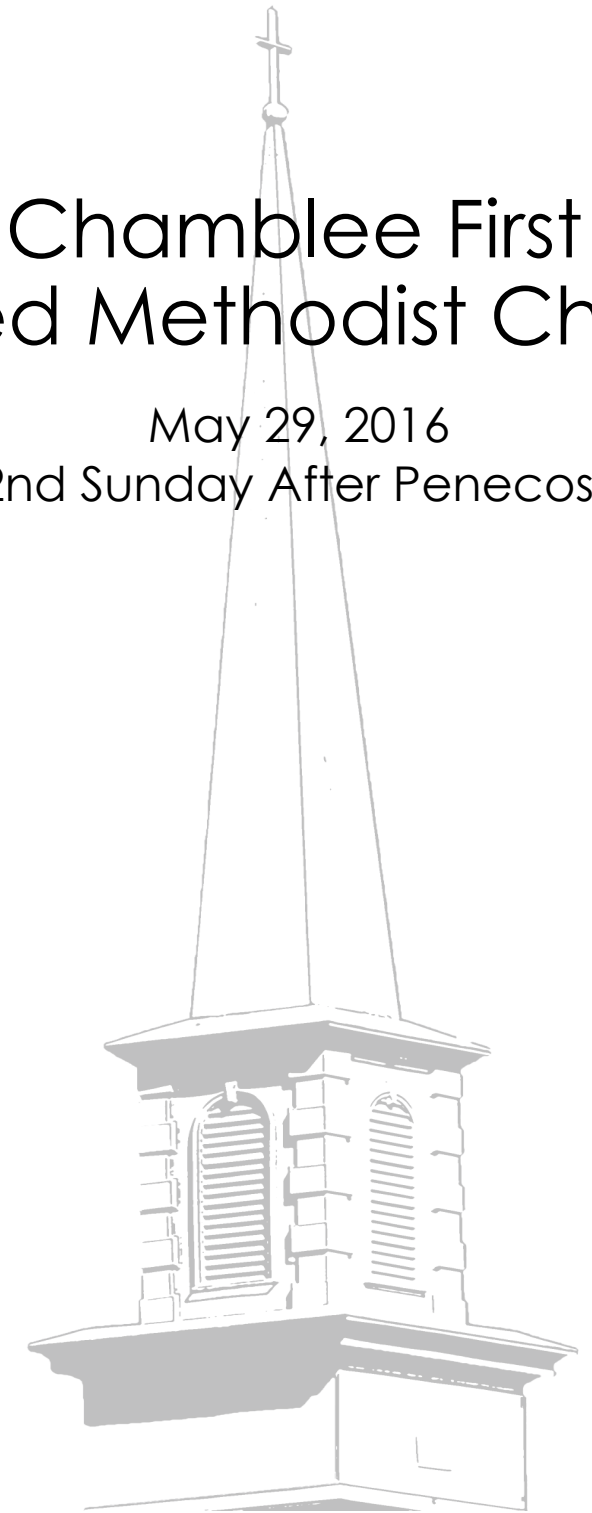

## Gospel Lesson

### Luke 7:1-10 (NRSV)

<sup>1</sup>After Jesus had finished all his sayings in the hearing of the people, he entered Capernaum. <sup>2</sup>A centurion there had a slave whom he valued highly, and who was ill and close to death. <sup>3</sup>When he heard about Jesus, he sent some Jewish elders to him, asking him to come and heal his slave. <sup>4</sup>When they came to Jesus, they appealed to him earnestly, saying, "He is worthy of having you do this for him, <sup>5</sup>for he loves our people, and it is he who built our synagogue for us." <sup>6</sup>And Jesus went with them, but when he was not far from the house, the centurion sent friends to say to him, "Lord, do not trouble yourself, for I am not worthy to have you come under my roof; <sup>7</sup>therefore I did not presume to come to you. But only speak the word, and let my servant be healed. <sup>8</sup>For I also am a man set under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes, and to another, 'Come,' and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this,' and the slave does it." <sup>9</sup>When Jesus heard this he was amazed at him, and turning to the crowd that followed him, he said, "I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith." <sup>10</sup>When those who had been sent returned to the house, they found the slave in good health.
