We continue to be in the slower part of construction. The footings have been poured in the Youth Hall/Music space areas and the concrete has gone through the curing process. Now the walls will be poured. Next, while the walls are curing, electrical conduits will be placed in this area followed by concrete pouring for the floors. Unfortunately all of the above work must be done in time stages using only one subcontractor at a time. Looking ahead the steel and trusses for all areas are ordered. When these items arrive and take their places, the entire project will begin to come alive with excitement as multiple contractors move into action.


Construction on the new parking lot along with the new drop off canopy located at the East end of the education building is moving right along. The big trucks continue bringing load after load of fill dirt followed by much packing. The ground will be raised to a level where entry at the drop off will be handicap accessible with no steps. Of course this feature bodes well for kindergarten use also. The finished parking lot will provide badly needed spaces near the new canopy for Parents Morning Out use during the week plus parking near the new narthex on Sundays. The present drive in front of the church will be slightly altered allowing drop off and pick up very close to the new narthex with no steps.
