- NEW for 2025! • A community of young adults including singles, couples, and new parents. Gather for faith-based lessons and discussions on marriage. family, work/life balance, and deeper connections with the Lord. Led by Rev. Zant, Leslie Hall, and other guest speakers, this new class will officially launch on Jan 26. Join us for preview sessions in the Hospitality Suite on Jan 12 & 20.
- **Bridge Class** • Focuses primarily on relationships. Studies discuss popular culture, books, and current events that raise challenging questions. Members range from families with school-aged children to established career professionals. Room 200
- **Faith Class** • The Faith Class is one of our largest Sunday school classes. Each Sunday begins with a short devotion by one of the class members followed by a praver of concerns and praises. Lessons are led by individual class members using selected study material typically spanning four to fourteen weeks. The class supports missions of the church as well as class specific activities. We prioritize mission opportunities, whether through the church or for causes and needs we recognize. Members represent wide range of ages and family types. 
Elementary Sunday School, 9:30-10:30
