Maundy Thursday, or Holy Thursday, is the first of the three days of solemn remembrance of the events leading up to and immediately following the crucifixion of Jesus. The English word "Maundy" comes from the Latin "mandatum," which means *commandment*.

As recorded in John's gospel, on the last night before his betrayal and arrest, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples and then gave them a new *commandment* to love one another as he had loved them (John 13: 34).

What to expect during tonight's service

- All are invited to come forward and participate in hand or foot washing. This is a symbolic act of humility and service, emphasizing love and reconciliation.
- The communion table of the United Methodist Church is open to all. You do not have to be a member of this church, or of any church, to participate.
- After coming to the altar rail to receive the elements by intinction, feel free to spend time at any of the six Prayer & Spiritual Discipline stations throughout the Sanctuary, or simply return to your seat for prayer and reflection.
